School Uniform

The current school uniform has been phased in since 2016; All children are now required to be wearing the current uniform from the commencement of the 2020 school year.

The old dark green polo top and jacket may no longer be worn.

A few reminders:

- 1. All children attending Good Samaritan are required to wear the correct school uniform.
- 2. To ensure comfort and that the uniform meets a diverse range of needs, the children have a number of options for their daily wear.
- 3. All items of clothing, including shoes, should be clearly named.
- 4. Grade 6 students are permitted to wear the Year 6 jacket throughout the year.
- 5. School shoes must be totally black in colour no other colour is to be visible. Here are a few examples of acceptable school shoes:








Uniform Shop


